In her spare time, Delreen is on the Board of Directors for the Illinois Association for Infant Mental Health and will be President of the Association beginning in 2017.





Why focus on social-emotional development?

- Crosses all areas of work: Monitoring Support, QRIS, Early Head Start, Food Program
- All communities of children and families
- Family child care setting where social emotional development may be more visible and more challenging for the provider
 - Small group
 - Siblings together
 - Family environment
 - Single adult managing multiple age groups




Scenario 2 "I can't do this"
